### The John Harrar Family of Pennsylvania

For many years Daniel Harrar (1756-1846), my great-great-grandfather, was the earliest Harrar that could be located. He and his wife Lydia lie buried in the Montgomery Baptist churchyard at Colmar, Pa. It was natural to conclude that the name was Welsh, inasmuch as the entire congregation of this little church at that time were Welsh Baptists. However nine postmasters in Wales, as well as the Royal Genealogical Society in London, denied that the name was Welsh.

A suggestion that the name might be of German origin was the discovery of a German-Lutheran Gesang-Buch, published in Germantown at an unknown date, and at present in the possession of Francis Diamant of Devon. On the fly-leaves of this hymnal, written in faded ink, are the names and dates of birth of seven of Daniel and Lydia's reputed nine sons. For the most part they are fairly legible, though the paper is torn and some fragments are missing. The list on one page is spelled "Harrar", on the other "Harar". This book may have belonged to Daniel and he have been the German-Lutheran. Grace Florence Harrar, daughter of Theodore Merwin Harrar, writes :

"My father seemed to know that there were Harrar families living in Germany about 1760, but he always said they were in England at an earlier date and declared he was of English descent. I do not believe he had any records to prove this. It was only family tradition, but he was very positive about it."

Further research has revealed that the name Harrar appears in English parish registers as early as 1539.

In the year 1616, a book was published in London called "The Four Brothers" written by Thomas Harrar. The only known copy in the Bodlean Library at Oxford.

Among owners of cattle in Bucks County, Pa., in 1684, appears the name Joseph Harmor. The names Harrah, Harrow, Harrer and Harer appear not infrequently in American city directories. In the early Pennsylvania tax lists our ancestors are variously recorded as Harrow, Harrah and Harrar.

The next definite find was the will of JOHN HARRAR, written in 1794, probated in 1799, at Philadelphia City Hall. He has proved to be the father of Daniel, and is now identified as the original Harrar immigrant. Confirming this fact was the discovery of the memoirs of John<sup>d</sup> Harrar, 1816-1911, of Philadelphia, in which he states as follows :

" My great-grandfather, JOHN HARRAR, came from Germany to America in the year 1760, to Philadelphia; bringing his wife and two sons, DANIEL and John, and John was my grandfather. His father first lived on the west side of Penrose Ferry Road near Point Breeze, the house having an old style Mansard roof, which my father called to my attention when passing by on the road in my boy-hood."

There are certain conflicting statements among my various authorities which make it difficult to assess the true facts as to the date of arrival of JOHN<sup>d</sup> in this country.

John<sup>4</sup> says in his memoirs :

"My great-grandfather JOHN<sup>1</sup> HARRAR came from Germany &c., --- bringing his wife and two sons, Daniel and John, and John, my grandfather, who was the youngest learned aboard of the ship coming over. Hence he was born about 1758."

Albaroni Harrar Woolley<sup>5</sup> writes me :

"The first Harrar came from Germany or France to Phila., Pa., in 1760 with his wife and four sons, Daniel, Joseph, John and Michael."

DANIEL<sup>2</sup> in his pension application papers states he was born in Frankford, Phila., County., Pa., Feb. 5, 1756.

JOHN<sup>1</sup> HARRAR in his will says : " I give to my eldest son John Harar ---. To my son Daniel Harar ---. &c"

Perhaps Daniel gave his birth-place as Phila. Co., rather than Germany in order to more readily get his pension, but that is entirely surmise. His date of birth on his tombstone in the Montgomery Baptist Churchyard is the same as that on his pension papers.

From Strass burger's "German Pioneers" :

1728 Johan Herer came in the ship Mortonhouse from Rotterdam, and took the oath of allegiance, He arrived in Pa. 23 Aug 1728

From Rupp's "30,000 German Emigrants" :

p 75 1732 Sept 19, sloop Johnson of London, David Crocket master, from Rotterdam, last from Deal - Johannes Hannar .

p 284 1752 Oct 4, Ship Neptune, John Mason captain, from Rotterdam, last from Cowes, Johann Michel Harfer.

From the index cards in the library of the Utah Genealogical Society at Salt Lake City there is record of a line of Horrers in Waldenbuch, Stuttgart, Wurttemberg, extending from 1780 back to 1520; in Neuenhaus, Wuerttemberg, one of Harrers from about 1730; while at Coppingen, Wuerttemberg, an Anna Catherine Harrar lived 1718- 1793. The name spelled Harrer is not unusual throughout Germany today.

LINEAGE OF JOHN HARRAR

His descendents

1. JOHN HARRAR<sup>1</sup> was probably born in Germany, though originally of English descent. His date of birth is unknown, possibly 1725 or 30. He emigrated to Philadelphia several years prior to 1760, and lived first on the west side of Penrose Ferry Road near Point Breeze. He died in July 1799. The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Helmuth of "Old Zion" German Lutheran church of Phila. His will dated 1794, as of Falls Township, Bucks County, was filed in Philadelphia in July 1799, and is on file at the Phila. City Hall. The name of his first wife, by whom he had all his children, is not known. His second wife, Mary, died in 1801, and is mentioned in his will.

(\*) individuals marked thus with a cross, will be described in detail further on. Each consecutive Harrar mentioned is assigned a number. The small Roman numerals denote the children in each family in order of birth. The asterisk number refers to the American generation in which the individual lived.

IN the name of God Amen, the 26th day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, I John Harrar, of the Falls Township in the County of Bucks, farmer, being of perfect mind and memory, thanks being given to God therefore; calling to mind the Mortality of my body, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament.

That is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it, and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth, to be buried in a Christian and decent manner, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Almighty Power of God.

And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form :

IMPRIMIS. It is my will and I do order that in the first place all my Just Debts and Funeral Charges be paid and satisfied.

ITEM. I give and bequeath unto Mary my beloved Wife, (and I do appoint Henry Maag my son-in-law Executor of this my Last Will and Testament) all the rents issues and profits of my Rail Estate, during the time she remains my lawful Widow, together all my Household Goods and Movables.

And at her decease, it is my will that the following Division may be made amongst my children.

VIZ. I give to my eldest son John Harrar the Sum of Thirty pounds. To my son Daniel Harar, whom I also appoint Executor to this my Last Will and Testament, the Sum of Sixty Pounds; to my son Michael Harar the Sum of Thirty Pounds, likewise my large Bible.

To my daughter Catrine Phillips the Sum of Thirty Pounds, and to my daughter Susannah Mack (Maag) the Sum of Thirty Pounds.

And to my step-daughter Mary Stone the Sum of Five Pounds, and to my other two step-daughters, Sarah and Rebecca the Sum of One Shilling and Eighteenpence each.

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other form of Testamnets, by me in any ways before this time named, willed and bequeathed. Ratifying and Confirming this, and no other, to be my last Will and Testament.

In WITNESS whereof, I have hereunto Set My Hand and Seal the Day and Year above written.

A "Presment of the Property of John Harar deceased July 20th 1799, was made August 4, 1799.

John<sup>4</sup> Harrar in his Memoirs goes on to say:  
 "How long he (John<sup>1</sup>) lived on Penrose Ferry Road is not known, but during the war of the Revolution he was farming not far from Valley Forge, near the line of Philadelphia and Montgomery Counties. His two sons, John and Daniel, wanted to go into the American army, but he was reluctant as he wanted to have them help on the farm. At this time 1777 the British army, being in possession of Philadelphia, were foraging around the country and seizing the horses worked on the farms. So that if the British troopers hove in sight, the only way to save the horses was to mount them and ride to or in the direction of Valley Forge. As one of the horses was finally lost, the two sons were allowed to enlist. They had active service in the battles of Germantown and Monmouth, in which John<sup>2</sup> had his right and left hand comrades shot down beside him."

(Phila. County included Montgomery County until Sept. 10th, 1784, when Montgomery was set aside as a separate county.)

John<sup>1</sup> Harrar seems to have lived in Cheltenham and Oxford townships, and possibly in Lower Dublin and Passyunk. In his will written in 1794 he describes himself as a farmer "residing in Falls Township, Bucks County, Pa.," and he leaves real estate consisting of one or more houses. There is no record of these holdings in the courthouse at Doylestown nor at Phila. City Hall.

He died July 20, 1799 and was attended in his last illness by a Dr. Herman. Burial services were conducted by the Rev. Helmuth\* according to the executor's expense account. He left 30 pounds "to my eldest son John, 60 pounds to my son Daniel," whom he also appointed executor along with his son-in-law Henry Maag who had married his daughter Susannah. To his son Michael he left 30 pounds, also his large family Bible. Joseph is not mentioned in the will. John<sup>4</sup> states he went to Joseph's funeral in 1823 when he was a small boy, and that Joseph was a bachelor. The executors collected rent for the widow Mary from John Scott and George Snyder. Interesting items in the inventory are a ten-plate stove and a pair of plated spurs.

2. John<sup>2</sup> Harrar, (John<sup>1</sup>) was born 1754-5 and died March 7, 1822. He first married Patience ---, by whom he had

\*Upon inquiry at Old Zion German Lutheran church of Phila., where Rev. Henry Helmuth was pastor at this time, the following is from the records :

"Buried; July 20, 1799; Johann Harr, of Camptown, laborer. Age 72 years, 2 mos. Ill 8 days with stitches in the side." According to the appraisalment of John<sup>1</sup> Harrar's estate, he died on the 20th of July. It seems doubtful if Johann Harr and John Harrar are the same. A.H. Woolley of Salt Lake agrees with me on this.

John<sup>2</sup> Harrar a few Years after the war married Patience ---, and settled in New Jersey. Their first child was a daughter, Patience<sup>3</sup>; then on July 1st, 1786-7, John<sup>3</sup> was born. The mother died in the son's infancy.

"She claimed some Indian blood", says John<sup>4</sup>. "Whether true or not, it may have been so, as neither my father, myself or either of my sons could cultivate a set of whiskers; but all having a very full head of hair, Indian fashion."

In May 1786 "for 60 pounds in gold and silver money", John Harrar purchased from Christopher Search a piece of property of some five acres in Byberry Township, Philadelphia county. It lay on "a certain road leading from Southampton to Swift's Mill on Rolsquesink Creek." It had once belonged to John Walton and his wife Barbara.

John<sup>2</sup> Harrar married again in Philadelphia (second wife's name not known) and had four children as noted above. John<sup>4</sup> remembered John<sup>2</sup>, his Revolutionary grandfather, very well. Of being at his home on the "north side of Carpenter Street, West of Fourth, in 1821."

"He was a man of large wiry frame, and had a great head of black hair." (That was before the possible of his wife Patience's Indian blood influence.)

John<sup>2</sup> died in 1823 at his son George's house on Coates Street west of Old York Road. He was a country carpenter and fence maker, and worked much for Stephen Girard. He had a house on Christian Street, south side between 2nd and 3rd Streets.

3. DANIEL<sup>2</sup> HARRAR, (John<sup>1</sup>) was born Feb. 5th, 1756 according to his headstone, and verified by his statement in his Revolutionary War pension papers (see Below), in Frankford, Phila., County, Pa. In contradiction to this, John<sup>4</sup> in his Memoirs says;

"My paternal great-grandfather came from Germany to America in the year 1760, with his wife and two sons, Daniel and John. John, my grandfather, who was the youngest, learned to walk aboard ship coming over."

However John<sup>1</sup> in his will refers to "John my eldest son," and then to Daniel. Daniel in his boyhood probably lived with his parents on the west side of Penrose Ferry Road near Point Breeze.

DANIEL<sup>2</sup> married Lydia ---, about 1777, and to them were born nine sons, of whom we have the identities of eight. Lydia was born Jan. 22d, 1755: died Feb 22d, 1818.

We must conclude that Daniel was the second son of John the emigrant. When his father died he was made executor along with his brother-in-law Henry Maag, his brother John being ignored. Daniel was left 60 pounds by his father, twice as much as any of the other children. Six months after his father's death he was baptized along with his wife Lydia and taken into membership in the Montgomery Baptist Church at Colmar, Pa. He lies buried in the churchyard alongside Lydia, having died Sept 27 1845. The names and dates of seven of his sons are inscribed in the hymnal above mentioned.

Aunt Mattie Anderson, his great-granddaughter, who was eight years old when he died, told me she could remember him as an old man who sat on the porch and would stick out his cane to trip her up, and then "laugh and laugh".

He died intestate in Montgomery county, and letters of administration were issued to his son William Harrar on Dec. 22, 1846.

He officiated as administrator in his son's John's estate in 1810. He appears in the Census of 1790 as residing in Lower Dublin Township, Phila. Co., as Daniel Harrow with six males under 16, and two white free females. One of these was his wife Lydia. The other female may have been a servant, or a daughter representing the fabled ninth child.

**Parents:** Names not shown.

**Birth:** February 5, 1756, in Frankford, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

**Service:** The veteran alleged that he enlisted in August 1776 and served two months as a private in Captain Jacob Leech's Pennsylvania Company. He enlisted in April 1777, served two months as a Private in Captain Jacob Leech's Company, Colonel's Magaw's and Daniel Hiester's Pennsylvania Regiments and was in the Battle of Bound Brook; he enlisted in April 1778 and served 2 months as a Private in Captain Joseph Rhoads' Pennsylvania Company; he enlisted and served on 4 tours of 2 months each, 1778 to 1780 as a Private in Captain Benjamin Dungan's Pennsylvania Company.

**Pension:** Daniel Harrar was allowed pension on Certificate No. 26 276 which was issued April 28, 1834, Act of June 7, 1832, Pennsylvania Agency.

**Family:** His brother-in-law, Henry Maag, was a resident of Frankford, Pennsylvania in 1834. There are no further family data.

**Residences:** In 1776 he lived in Cheltenham Township, Philadelphia County, Penna. In 1777 he resided in Oxford Township, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania. After the Revolutionary War he lived in Philadelphia County. In 1834 he was living in Montgomery Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, in which County he has resided about 30 years.

**Death:** Date and place not shown."

Referring then to the Comptroller General of the U.S. General Accounting Office, Washington D.C. The following is from their letter of Dec. 12, 1940:

"The records of this office show that on April 16, 1847, satisfactory evidence was presented to the Court of Common Pleas held at Norristown, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, that the pensioner died on September 27, 1846, and left surviving no widow, but the following named children:

William Harrar was appointed administrator of the estate. The arrears of pension due the decedent, covering the period from March 4, 1846 to September 27, 1846, were paid on April 28, 1847, at the Pension Agency in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to the administrator."

9. John<sup>3</sup> Harrar, (John<sup>1</sup>, John<sup>2</sup>) was born July 1, 1786-7 in New Jersey. He died May 2, 1873. Married Ann Law, daughter of Samuel Law and Mary Lewis then aged 14. The latter's father being Manuel Lewis of Portuguese Jewish descent, says John<sup>4</sup> in his Memoirs. Ann Law was born in Philadelphia Mar. 27, 1793, and died April 19, 1857. This John Harrar was a carpenter by trade. He failed mentally in his latter years, his son speaking of him as "still physically sound". He is listed in the Philadelphia City Directory as a carpenter at "324 S 3rd Street" in 1811, "back 108 Christian" 1813, "Laus Court in 1819.

"My grandfather John<sup>2</sup> died at Uncle George's house on Coats west of old York Road in 1822. --- Coats Street, now known as Fairmount Avenue, where Uncle George lived in 1825. At this time Coats and Sixth was the south-west corner of the city. ---- My father (John<sup>3</sup>) in 1832 lived in Bird Street. Uncle George Harrar came in a Dearborn wagon and took his and my father's families a blackberrying at Flat Rock on the Schuylkill."

Finally in 1864 he secured a position in the passenger department of the Pennsylvania Railroad. In 1875 he was advanced to the position of General Passenger Agent at Williamsport, Pa., where he remained until his death in 1907.

He was brought up as a child in the household of Josiah Rich, a bachelor, near Danborough, Pa. He died in Lansdale, Pa. while on a trip to visit his farm at Colmar. He was buried in the Montgomery Baptist churchyard at Colmar, the remains being later removed to Williamsport, Pa., and rest alongside those of his wife in the city where he spent the major part of his life.

A copy of the minutes presented by his business associates at the Third Annual Meeting of the Association of Passenger Representatives of the Pennsylvania System held at Pittsburg November 15, 1907, contains the following remarks :

" Ellwood S. Harrar, Division Ticket Agent of the Philadelphia and Erie Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad died at Colmar Pa., on Friday, Oct. 25, 1907. Mr. Harrar was man of fine sensibility, pure in heart and without guile. Of a nature gentle, but unafraid, he approached the problems of life with a firm purpose and he worked them out in that quiet, yet persistent and determined spirit which wins achievement with the least possible friction.

A naturally intelligent mind he enriched by reading and Observation, and he brought to the execution of his work a mental equipment which was at once ready and comprehensive. In his forty-three years of service, although at no time physically robust, he never quailed at his task, but made himself master of the conditions existing in the territory under his charge. His reports were intelligent and thorough, his opinions mature and conservative, and his labors in the field active and unremitting. His loyalty to the Company was deep and true and his efforts to promote its interests by every honorable means never flagged. (signed) J.R.Wood, Chairman
